



Fulham Solar Farm and Battery project Construction Update – April 2026

The Fulham Solar Farm and Battery project is a 80 MW (megawatt) renewable energy development with DC-coupled battery storage of up to 128 MW hours. The project will generate enough energy to power around 39,000 homes once operational.

Works are underway

Construction is progressing smoothly with the current works:

- solar array mechanical installation
- BESS area civil works
- electrical trenches
- ongoing site maintenance
- slashing and waste management
- Health, safety and environment – ongoing inspections

Upcoming works include:

- PV modules installation
- drainage installation
- electrical area – sound installation

Deliveries to site are forecast to increase, we expect roughly 45 trucks moving to and from site each day.

What to expect

As we conduct these works, you may notice the following:

- **Noise and dust** – there may be varying levels during work hours. We will monitor and manage both in line with environmental guidelines.
- **Vehicle movements** – until the internal road is complete; deliveries of materials and equipment will continue to enter the site via Hopkins Road and then McLarens Road to minimise disruption.
- **Site compound activity** – construction traffic will enter and exit the site compound from Hopkins Road.
- **Planned utility service outages** – If any temporary outages are required, further information will be provided to the affected residents prior to the works.

Please note vehicle movements to and from site may occur either side of these working hours to allow for return travel.
